- Parents Meeting Date — We are planning a

CLC Council



The CELC Council held its regular monthly meeting on July 19. The Council welcomed two new members, Rhea McVicker and Steve North, who have replaced resigning members Chee Kin Tang and Robert Dalzell.

Much of the meeting focused on the progress of our Graceful Growing Together (GGT) redevelopment initiative. On July 12, Pastor Marv Tollefson presented the church's plans before the Montgomery County Council as part of the Woodmont Triangle zoning hearings. He emphasized the community- and family-oriented ministries we envision in the rede-

velopment and the lack of those services in the area right now. Feedback from the county council at the presentation appeared good, although no formal zoning approval has taken place yet.

In other GGT work, a meeting is scheduled this month with the National Lutheran Home to discuss possible future options for housing Bethesda Fellowship House.

One of the main GGT choices the Council has been weighing is whether to relocate church activities for a relatively brief period (approximately two years) to allow reconstruction to be finished all at once or to stay in place while reconstruc-

tion goes on around us at a far slower pace (six years). The Council supports the two-year option for a number of important reasons, primarily safety concerns and the desire to finish the construction activity as soon as possible.

There will be a congregational information session after the 10 a.m. blended worship on Sunday, Aug. 7, to update the congregation in detail on these and other recent GGT activities. A hospitality brunch will be held after the meeting.

The Council also reviewed plans for the church's Kid Safe program, a proactive multi-pronged initiative researched and developed by the Family Ministry team to assure safety for all children and teens under the church's care. More information will be available when final details of the program are in place.

The Council also has been actively planning for and promoting the DC Festival with Luis Palau, set for October 8 and 9 on the National Mall. This a major event sponsored by many area churches, and many volunteer opportunities are available for this event. For more information, please speak to Pastor Marv or Jennifer Tessneer.
